ACCREDITATION TEAM INVITES PUBLIC COMMENTS ABOUT DEPARTMENT OF LOTTERY, OFFICE OF INSPECTOR GENERAL

TALLAHASSEE – A team of assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) will arrive July 31, 2019, to examine all aspects of the Office of Inspector General's policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services. The Office of Inspector General must comply with approximately 44 standards in order to receive accredited status.

As part of the onsite assessment, agency members and the general public are invited to offer comments to the assessment team. Comments must be in writing and must address the office's ability to comply with CFA standards. A copy of the standards is available through the Department of Lottery, Office of Inspector General, in Tallahassee at 850-487-7726. According to Ray Pace, Accreditation Manager for the Department of Lottery's Office of Inspector General, the assessment team is composed of law enforcement practitioners from similar agencies. The assessors will review written materials, interview individuals, and visit offices and other places where compliance can be witnessed. The CFA Assessment Team Leader is Investigator Randy Conyers, Office of the Inspector General, Florida Department of Transportation. The second team member is Captain Michael Meaney, Office of the Inspector General, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

Once the CFA's assessors complete their review of the agency, they report back to the full Commission, which will then decide if the agency is to receive accredited status. The Department of Lottery's Office of Inspector General was initially accredited July 1, 2010. The accreditation is for a 3-year period and the Department of Lottery's Office of Inspector General was reaccredited on September 25, 2013, and October 26, 2016. Verification by the team that the Department of Lottery's Office of Inspector General meets the CFA's standards is part of a voluntary process to gain or maintain accreditation, a highly prized recognition of professional excellence.
