Department of the Lottery 2018-2019 Regulatory Plane

Below is the Department of the Lottery's 2018-2019 Regulatory Plan (or "plan") which has been prepared in accordance with the requirements set forth in Section 120.74(1), Florida Statutes.

1. Plan Requirements of Section 120.74(1)(a), Florida Statutes (2018):

Section 120.74(1)(a), Florida Statutes, provides that an agency's plan must include a listing of each law enacted or amended during the previous 12 months which created or modified the duties or authority of the agency and a statement as to whether rulemaking is required to implement the law.

The duties and authority of the Department of the Lottery ("Department") are primarily identified in Chapter 24, Florida Statutes. That chapter was not amended during the previous 12 months.

Further, the Department of the Lottery has reviewed the below-listed laws enacted or amended during the previous 12-months which may modify the duties or authority of the Lottery, in the same way as to all other agencies of the executive branch, and the Department has determined that corresponding rulemaking by the Department is not necessary to implement the listed laws. Each listed law provides a sufficient level of detail and clarity to be executed by the Department without rulemaking. Notably, none of the below-listed laws required the Department to initiate rulemaking.

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2. Plan Requirements of Section 120.74(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2018):

Section 120.74(1)(b), Florida Statutes, provides that an agency's plan must include a listing of any other laws which the agency expects to implement by rulemaking before the following July 1, except emergency rulemaking.

All but two of the Department's rules are promulgated by emergency rulemaking in accordance with the emergency rulemaking authority granted to the Department in Section 24.109(1), Florida Statutes. Laws implemented by emergency rulemaking are excluded from the requirements of Section 120.74(1)(b), Florida Statutes, and thus not included in the plan.

The Department initiated the repeal of Rule 53-1.005, Confidential Information, in September of 2017, because it was superseded by Emergency Rule 53ER17-57 and is obsolete. The Department, however, did not complete the rule repeal process as anticipated due in part to the introduction and movement of HB 459.

The Department intends to re-initiate rulemaking for the repeal of Rule 53-1.005. The law implemented by Rule 53-1.005 is 24.105(12) F.S.

The Department does not presently have plans to implement any other laws by non-emergency rulemaking before July 1, 2019. However, the Department is still evaluating and reviewing its permanent and emergency rules, and may update this section later, depending on the outcome of the review.

3. Plan Requirements of Section 120.74(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2018):

Section 120.74(1)(c), Florida Statutes, provides that an agency's plan must include any desired update to the prior year's regulatory plan; furthermore, if laws requiring rulemaking were identified in a prior years' plan but a notice of proposed rulemaking has not yet been published, the agency must make the statements as required in Section 120.74(1)(c)1. and 2.

The Department's 2017-2018 plan is updated to state that the Department will re-initiate the repeal of Rule 53-1.005, Confidential Information, during the 2018-2019 reporting year.

The 2017-2018 Regulatory Plan did not identify laws requiring rulemaking under paragraph (1)(c) or under subparagraph (1)(a)1.
